UNIVERSITY OF CEYLON REVIEW

The University of Ceylon was established on the 1st July, 1942, by the fusion of the Ceylon Medical College (founded 1870) and the Ceylon University College (founded 1921). It has at present Faculties of Oriental Studies, Arts, Science and Medicine. Its seat is temporarily in Colombo, but it will be moved to Peradeniya, near Kandy, as soon as its new buildings are ready for occupation. The University has taken over from the Government of Ceylon the publication of the Ceylon Journal of Science, which will be developed as its chief means of contact with Scientists elsewhere as soon as paper supplies enable issues to be published more frequently and regularly. The University of Ceylon Review has been founded in order to make similar contact with scholars in literary subjects, to provide a medium of publication for the research in those subjects conducted in the University, and to provide a learned review for Ceylon. The Review will normally be published twice a year, in April and in October. The price of a single copy is Rs. 2.50.
